

Tips for Reading Together


Children learn best when learning is fun.

- Talk about the title and the picture on the cover.
- Identify the letter patterns *ea*, *ee* and *y* and talk about the sound (phoneme) they make when you read them.
- Look at the *ea*, *ee* and *y* words on page 4. Say each word and then say the sounds in each word (e.g. *seat*, *s-ea-t*; *feet*, *f-ee-t*; *sandy*, *s-a-n-d-y*).
- Read the story and find the words with ea and ee.
- Do the fun activity at the end of the book.

Children enjoy re-reading stories and this helps to build their confidence.






Gran had a hut, by the sea.

"Cheese rolls," said Gran. "Then jelly and cream."




"What a picnic," said Biff.
"It's a feast."




Gran had a boat at the jetty.




"I call it Jolly Jean," she said.

"I can see a seal," said Chip.




But then the sea was choppy. The boat went up and down.




"My tummy feels funny," said Wilma.



"Sorry," said Gran. "We had too much jelly and cream."




They went back to the beach hut.


