### Glossary of terms

Fred Talk: Fred is a puppet who can only say and read words in pure sounds; he cannot say the whole word. He never adds 'uh' after a consonant sound e.g. fuh, luh, muh. (A slight 'uh' cannot be helped when saying the sounds b, d, g, j, w and y)

Grapheme: One letter or one group of letters used to write one sound e.g.

The sound 'f' can be written with the grapheme f (fun) or ff (huff) or ph (photo)

The sound 'c' can be written with the grapheme c (cat) or k (key) or ck (clock)

Green words: Words made up of the graphemes listed in the sound boxes on page 4

Red words: Common words with a grapheme not listed in the sound boxes; e.g. said

Challenge words: Words particular to the topic of this story

Syllables: Chunks within long words

**Root:** The part of the word that gives the most meaning

#### How to use this book

Follow the advice, in italics, given for you on each page.

Support the children as they read the text that is shaded in cream.

Praise the children at every step!

Detailed guidance is provided in the Read Write Inc. Phonics Handbook.

#### 8 reading activities

#### Children:

- Practise reading the speed sounds.
- Read the green, red and challenge words for the story.
- Listen as you read the introduction.
- · Discuss the vocabulary check with you.
- · Read the story.
- · Re-read the story and discuss the 'questions to talk about'.
- · Re-read the story with fluency and expression.
- Practise reading the speed words.

Each box contains one sound but sometimes more than one grapheme. Focus graphemes are circled.

#### Green words

Read in Fred Talk (pure sounds).

mad off pink his back grass whizz

Read in syllables.

ra<u>bb</u>′ it → ra<u>bb</u>it

Read the root word first and then with the ending.

sob  $\rightarrow$  sobs  $\underline{thank} \rightarrow \underline{thanks}$  fling  $\rightarrow$  flings

## Vocabulary check


#### **Introduction**

Do you have a favourite thing that you like to wear? Jen loves her pink rabbit hat. She is really upset when Ben runs off with it. But then Sid, the skateboard champ, arrives to help her. Let's see what happens.

# Ben grabs Jen's pink rabbit hat and runs off.

Page 10: What does Ben do when Sid arrives?

**Page 11:** What does Sid do with the hat?

Why do you think he does this?

**Page 12:** What does Ben do with the hat?

Page 13: What is Jen feeling? (pleased, grateful, happy)
