And God said, "Let the waters be filled with living creatures, and let birds fly through the skies." So God made creatures of every kind that live in the sea and every winged bird that soars above.


And God saw that it was good and He blessed them. And so ended the fifth day of God's marvelous creation.

Affirmation: I will go where God sends me!


LET MY PEOPLE GO!

THE PASSOVER

Exodus 12:13 And when I see the blood, I will pass over you.

The Lord told Moses and Aaron how to prepare for the last plague. "Tell My people that on the tenth day of this month, each household is to select one perfect lamb. Take care of it for four days and then kill the lamb at twilight. Take some of the lamb's blood and smear it on the sides and top of your doorposts. That night, you are to eat the lamb in haste, for it is the Lord's Passover.

On that night, the Lord will pass through Egypt. But when I see the lamb's blood on your doorposts, I will pass over you. You are to remember this day forever, and celebrate your freedom."

At midnight the death angel came and all the first-born in every household in Egypt died, even "Pharaoh's son. But no one died in the Israelite homes with the blood smeared over the door. Pharaoh cried to Moses, "Go! Leave as fast as you can before we all die." The Israelites were free at last.

THE TOWER OF BABEL

Genesis 11:9a That is why it was called Babel - because there the LORD confused the language of the whole world.

After the great flood, Noah's children began to raise families. Their children had more children until the earth was one big family with only one language. These families began to move eastward until they came to a place called Shinar.

There the ground was just right for making bricks and there was plenty of asphalt for mortar. They said, "Let's build a great city with a tower reaching to heaven."



So with bricks and tar the people of Shinar began building a tower to reach the very gates of heaven. When God came down and saw the tower, He was displeased. "These people believe


