

BEFORE READING

Talk together

- Look at the cover picture together and read the title and blurb. Ask: What do you think will happen in this story?
- Look through the book and talk about the pictures.

Say the sounds

These are the focus letters and sounds your child will practise in this book.

ch sh ee ar ow (as in town)
ear (as in dear)

Sound the words

These words practise the focus letters and sounds for this book. Encourage your child to say the sounds from left to right to read the words.

crunch crash street screech windscreen park town dear

Read these words together

These words are common but children may find them hard to read at this stage.

The car crept along the road. "There is too much traffic!" said Gran.




- "What shall we get Dad?" said Biff.
- "An electric drill?" said Chip.




They got to town. "We can park in this street," said Gran.



The children went into lots of shops. "Still no luck," said Kipper.




Just then, there was a screech and then a crunch.




"Dear me," said Gran. "What a crash!"

"Wow, that looks like fun!" said Kipper. "We have go-karts for children too," said Greg.




"We still do not have a present for Dad," said Chip.

AFTER READING

Word beginnings

 Take turns to think of words beginning with scr like screech (e.g. scream, scrap). Then take turns to think of other words that begin with str, like street.

WHAT IS BLENDING?

For reading (decoding) say the sounds from left to right of the word and blend the sounds to hear the whole word.

How to blend

Point under each grapheme (letter or letter group) as you say the sound, then run your finger under the whole word as you say the whole (or blended) word.

e.g. c-r-u-n-ch crunch





At the last moment, Cosmo jumped backwards into the lake.

Tyro hesitated. She didn't like water.






"Oh, dear," said Cosmo. He wasn't scared any more. "I don't suppose you want my help. I'm only a little mouthful."


"PLEASE!" howled Tyro. "I'll do anything you want."

He stamped his foot on the island.


Patty's head popped out of the water next to him.


Then, everyone realized what had

"Nonsense," said Cosmo. "I could never have done it without Patty. It was just good teamwork."


"Now, what happened to our game of boulder ball?" asked Cosmo.
