



Tips for Reading Together

Children learn best when they are having fun.

- Tell your child they are going to play a more difficult game of 'I spy'.
- On each page, read the instruction aloud, then ask your child to read the phrases on the left hand pages and try to match them to the pictures on the right.
- Encourage your child to sound out the letters and say the words (e.g. l-i-d lid)
- Your child will have to read carefully because there are some tricky pages!
- Do the spot the difference activity with your child.




